




Positive SAT outcomes with Cambridge

At Broward County Public Schools, Florida, the 6th largest district in the U.S., students who participated in Cambridge Advanced (International AS Level) Global Perspectives & Research, English General Paper, and Thinking Skills demonstrated higher first-time SAT scores than their similar peers who did not take those courses. Reported results based on preliminary analysis.


Global Perspectives & Research

English General Paper


Mean first-time SAT scores (n=1,148 matched pairs)

Cambridge Advanced core courses

Cambridge International AS Level English General Paper, Thinking Skills, and Global Perspectives & Research are college-level, skills-based interdisciplinary courses and exams often used by high schools as common touchpoints in implementing the Cambridge program.

Global Perspectives & Research

- Challenges learners to think critically, analyze evidence and compare perspectives through analysis of global issues
- Assessed through a team project and presentation as well as a written examination
- Core requirement for the Cambridge AICE Diploma.

Thinking Skills

- Develops transferable skills including critical thinking, reasoning and problem solving
- Students learn how to make informed and reasoned decisions and construct evidence-based arguments
- Builds confidence and equips students with a toolkit for tackling complex and unfamiliar subjects.

English General Paper

- Builds learners' ability to understand and write in English through the study of a broad range of contemporary topics
- Develops highly transferrable skills including analyzing opinions and ideas and learning to construct an argument
- Often used as an introduction to advanced academics.
